The A2S Youth Center will offer us a unique opportunity to fully plant our roots within the community, cut our program cost, and have a central location from which we run our programs. This building will be a game changer.

We are truly grateful for your friendship and look forward to the many ways that the Lord will use us to be blessings to the work he is doing around the world. 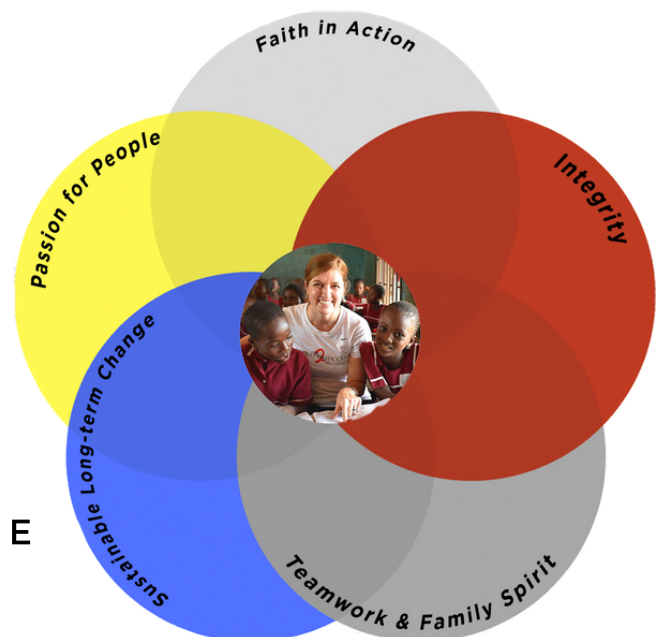

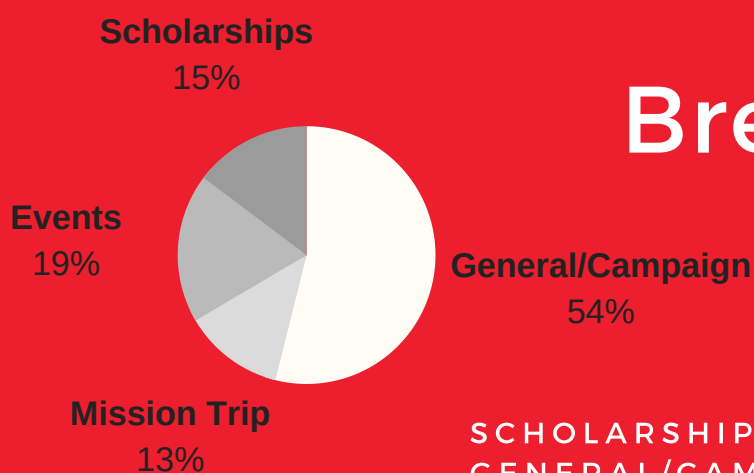

Giving Breakdown

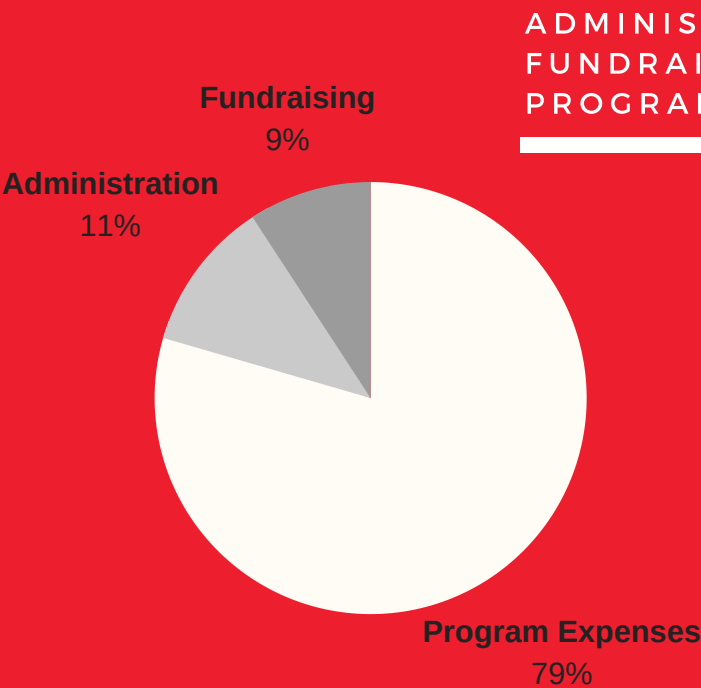

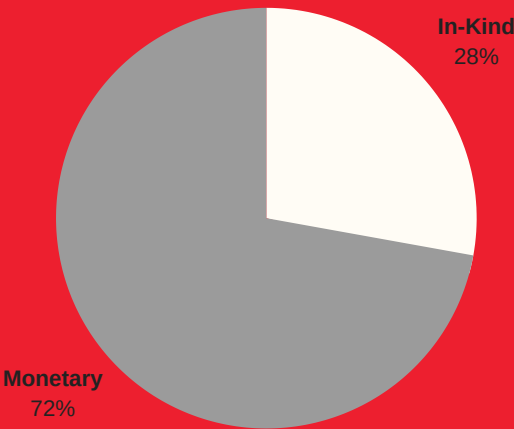

AFTER SCHOOL ACADEMY

PURPOSE:

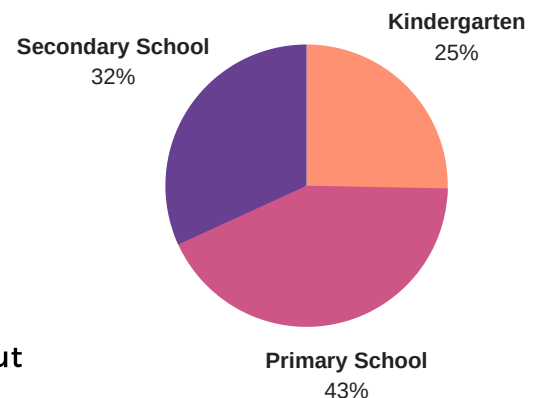
The A2S After School Academy is a program that uses organized educational activities within the Nigerian curriculum to help provide rare basic needs to children while helping them gain social skills and leadership experience. At a more foundational level, the A2S After School Academy helps children who would otherwise be out of school or on the streets attend school, spend time constructively after school, and stay safe off the streets. Our goal for the academy is to keep children in school, improve their scores, help them move from one grade level to another, and hopefully become productive young adults in society.

DESIRED 2018 OUTCOMES

- A: 75% of academy students will improve class ranking over a 3-term period - Result: 91% of students moved to the next class grade and improved class ranking
- B: Retain 90% of students served - Result: 95.9% of students retained
- C: 50% of students will pass JAMB (SAT Equivalent) within first year - Result: 57.14% passed JAMB
- D: 70% of academy students will participate in summer VBS - Result: 100% of academy student participated in summer VBS

2018 OUTPUT

- 531,267 meals served
- Over 48,971 direct education hours delivered
- Over 300 backpacks dispersed
- More than 500 shoes distributed
- 5000 notebooks given
- More than 3000 subject specific instruments handed out

"I am 19 years old, and I learned about A2S when the secretariat moved to the street where my mummy's shop is located. A2S has provided scholarship for me to continue in my medical schooling. My inspiration for continuing in medicine is joy. It is a privilege to see joy on people's faces when they are well and healthy, especially kids. I've always wanted to be able to give joy, to remove pain and fear that comes with ill health. In 5 years, I hope to start my residency training in surgery. People get inspired by what they hear/read, I hope that people can read my story and be inspired to let God make them the best they can be."

The joy I get from teaching the children at the After School Academy can't be measured. During the A2S Scholarship Student retreat last year, I was told to speak on the topic of problem solving. I shared with the kids some of the ways in which I handled some problems when I was in university and to my surprise, most of them were passing through such problems and were grateful for the solution I shared. Serving the kids during my national youth service Corp is truly a dream come true."

U.S. SCHOLARSHIPS

PURPOSE:

The A2S US Scholarship Program is an opportunity to bridge the gaps between opportunity and success by lifting a select group of young scholars out of a restrictive environment, and providing them with the tools and opportunities needed for success, while building trust and fostering goodwill between the international students, the local communities, and their families.

- **Desired outcome:** 75% of A2S Scholars move from one grade to next
- **Results:** 100% of A2S scholars moved from one grade to the next



Jafar Musa will graduate from Concord University in May of 2019. He hopes to remain in the states to gain practical work experience for another year or two, before returning to Nigeria as an entrepreneur.

Uche Ufochukwu is moving forward with graduating early and continuing to work toward her Master's in Marketing, while participating in her final year of eligibility. She is currently recovering from a minor injury that sidelined her for the remainder of the year, however she is in recovering and doing well.



Jennifer Omonuwa graduates from Concord First Assembly in May of 2019. She is in the process of choosing which college she will attend in the fall, and hopes to study pre-law.

Wisdom Asaboro is completing his junior year at Covenant Day School in Charlotte. He enjoyed another successful year of football, although he is now recovering from a minor knee injury and completing his official prospective college visits, for the year.



Justice Ajogbor is a junior this year at Christ School in Asheville. He continues to do well in basketball and academics, and he is making regular visits to prospective universities.

HOOPS FOR HOPE

Hoops for Hope is a night of fun and basketball meant to raise awareness, shoes, and funds for the mission of A2S. In 2018, Davidson College participated, for their tenth year, collecting **95 pair** of new and lightly used shoes for our summer programs. Appalachian State held their very first Hoops for Hope game, collecting **51 pairs** of shoes that we were able to take with us, and distribute at our annual basketball and empowerment camp. We are so grateful to each of these schools for their support and willingness to join alongside us as we provide education and opportunity for the children/youth in Nigeria.



MISSION TRIP



Every year, our mission trips are a life-changing experiences that provide personal insight into how we work with our partners on-ground to bring about positive, sustainable changes for Nigerian people. This year was no different. Team One worked closely with our Nigerian staff and coaches to facilitate a successful Basketball and Empowerment Camp for 450+ youth. Campers played basketball, made new friends, and discussed their visions for Nigeria and for themselves. They also learned techniques to manage their time, enabling them to identify the steps and start fulfilling their dreams as outlined in their personal vision maps.

The moment Team Two arrived in Benin City, they hit the ground running! While part of our team focused on Vacation Bible School with our A2S kids, the others worked hard at our second annual Entrepreneur Incubator. Our U.S. and African judges came together over three days to provide feedback and guidance in this year's pitch competition, and at the end of our program, three teams were selected, by our judges, to participate in our year-round Incubator, where they will be mentored by African and U.S. business leaders.

ENTREPRENEUR INCUBATOR

The Entrepreneur Incubator inspires a cross-cultural collaborative community that combines key aspects of conscious capitalism, micro-finance, and human capital development to positively influence young and promising stakeholders in Nigeria's fast-growing entrepreneurial landscape. 2018 PITCH COMPETITION WINNERS!



KINGFISHER is an agro-business dealing in the sale of fresh and smoked (preserved) catfish. The company also engages in fish farm consultancy services, such as fish feed formulation. Kingfishers are motivated by Nigeria's abundance of richly blessed agricultural produce. They desire to position the Nigerian agricultural sector as a major economic driver for the country.

JESUS REIGNS AGROFIELDS deals in the year-round production of hybrid maize varieties with high yield, which mature as early as 80-85 days. Their vision is to create a crop production that will ensure food security in Nigeria and have a significant effect on the nation's GDP. Their produce would be disease and pest-resistant to benefit consumers, livestock farmers, and food processing companies in Edo State. Jesus Reigns Agrofields find their motivation in the population of hungry and unemployed young people in their community who have unrealized dreams due to lack of finance.

PAYMEDIX is focused on medical savings, payment processing, emergency medical loans, and insurance. Their system allows clients to carry their medical history in a card form. Paymedix will provide single-purpose, prepaid cards to be used specifically for medical payments. Their motivations for success include lack of access to medical history in hospitals, unavailability of quick and easy payment processing for medical services, absence of a dedicated medical savings and insurance system to assist health expenses, lack of first-mile data to HMO's, and the unemployment rate in Nigeria.
