







# **Statement of Ministry**

Access to Success (A2S) is a Christian non-profit organization dedicated to playing its part in eliminating poverty and providing hope through education and opportunity. Our ministry was founded on the premise that everyone should have an opportunity to dream, irrespective of location.

A2S believes that Christ welcomes all. Our policy supports providing hope and promoting change irrespective of race or religion. We embrace supporters and volunteers from all backgrounds.

At A2S, our motivation stems from Jeremiah 29:11 that says, "For I know the plans I have for you, 'declares the Lord' plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Our ministry and approach hinge on a few major theological concepts. A2S follows the teachings of Jesus Christ, who exemplified unconditional love, and said to be not only "hearers but doers." We operate a hands-on approach of expressing love through action, providing year-round programs to help provide hope and a future to those in need.



## A word from our Founder, Andrew Lovedale

Dear A2S Family,

2021 was quite the year at A2S. We were not only challenged by the effects of Covid-19, but it also changed us. It affected how we relate, work, serve, and engage others. At A2S we saw our

supporters press further into the mission, our team mastered being adept at making changes, and our combined efforts enabled children and youth to continue to dream. Inflation put a lot of pressure on homes and over 40 percent of Nigerians lived below the poverty line. 13.5 million children were out of school, 96% of businesses failed within 10 years, and the effects of the pandemic continued to force children out of school. In 2021, under these circumstances, we were challenged to be better, and we responded with positive change. As a member of the A2S family, you responded by being answers to the prayers we prayed entering 2021 - to reflect God's love in our thoughts, words, and actions, especially to those most vulnerable among us.

I am thankful for our growing A2S family. In my life, I have been given two gifts the gifts of love and consistency. As my story continues to unfold, I marvel at this God-given mission called A2S that you and I are a part of. When you invest in our youth, you invest in more than just dreams. You invest in diverse communities and relationships that matter enough to help lift many out of poverty. Thanks to your response, at A2S, 240 children were served daily. Over 250 entrepreneurs are supported with resources to ensure business success. Over 60 of our scholars are spread across universities in Nigeria and 7 are currently pursuing their education in the U.S. We employ 17 full time staff and 10 part-time staff. 3,500 widows and orphans displaced from their homes by Boko Haram are provided a week's worth of food supplies every month. This family continues to lead the Lord's charge in Matthew 25:40 when He said "truly whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

## A word from our Founder, Andrew Lovedale

Our kids are thriving and we are excited about increasing our impact. Entering the second year of the 10 year Season of Promise, A2S is poised to become a more sustainable organization. This starts with our Youth Center, a place we get to call HOME. We are so thankful to all who have made this growth possible. The A2S Season of Promise, which began in 2020, is our decade-long commitment to evolving as a social enterprise using the talents of our staff, entrepreneurs, and local community to create self-sustaining revenue-generating endeavors that will support the grassroots operations of our organization. With this Youth Center, we will be able to expand our impact to serve 300 children through our After School Academy. Our programming will grow to include adult literacy and other workforce development initiatives to bridge the gap between education and employment. This year in 2021, we sowed the seeds to finish our Youth Center project and to continue making our dreams for our children a reality.

Our vision has remained the same - that each child/person in Nigeria finds a dignified path to a successful life and is empowered to live out God's plan for a future filled with hope. 
### **A2S Thought Partners**





### **Meet Precious**



Precious attended the A2S basketball camp in the summer of 2021. Initially to our staff and our coaches it was unclear why she had wanted to attend. On the court it looked as if she had never touched a basketball. Some campers jeered as she attempted to launch the ball towards the hoop. Ready to intervene, A2S Founder Andrew Lovedale approached one of the A2S University Scholars volunteering at the camp. He then discovered the campers weren't making fun. They were encouraging her because they knew her story. Precious lost both of her parents and was forced to drop out of school. After a year and a half of trying to make ends meet on her own, she came to the A2S camp because A2S was her last hope to continue her education and make a life for herself. Precious had never played basketball in her life- but she saw the A2S camp as an opportunity to be seen by the A2S community.



The After School Academy was full for the year- but after learning her story, the A2S team enrolled her. Precious has truly become an A2S Academy Kid in every sense of the term. Our staff has looked after her like family this past year to make sure she has what she needs at the end of the day- including packing extra meals and clothing for her to take home. Precious dreams of becoming a chef and most looks up to our After School Academy Director, Fustina, who has quickly stepped into a motherly role for Precious.




## Scholars Program Nigeria

#### Meeting of the Medical Minds

Jamie and Tim Flerlage are A2S donors and members of our FaithFuel community. Jamie and Tim both studied medicine at Johns Hopkins University and completed their residencies there in pediatrics. Now Jamie and Tim work at St. Jude's Research Hospital in Memphis. Jamie is an assistant faculty member and Tim is an instructor.

In 2021, Jamie and Tim started a new initiative for our medical scholars. As they learned more about A2S, they became increasingly interested in getting to know the students and providing some guidance on their university journeys. We began holding regular Zoom sessions with the Flerlages and our medical scholars and as they got to know each other, Jamie and Tim have coached our scholars through a tough medical journey compared to what they had experienced as students in the U.S. They have been working closely with A2S to expand our pool of resources for our children while also encouraging the students to utilize the opportunities around them.

#### Outcomes

#### **Strikes**

Our scholars in Nigeria attend public universities that have been subject to staff and faculty strikes. As the Nigerian government struggles to pay its employees on time, staff and faculty have regularly protested through strikes that have interrupted lectures periodically this year. Our scholars have had to think creatively on how to most productively use their idle time.

#### Nigeria

#### **Creating Opportunity**

Gideon is an A2S Scholar who is currently studying Electrical Engineering at a university in Nigeria. He and 3 of his siblings attended the After School Academy. After their father's passing early on, their mother has struggled to make ends meet. The A2S After School Academy and Scholars Program were the only ways Gideon and his siblings could afford to attend school.

During the pandemic, Gideon did not want to just be idle. In 2020, his university had experienced numerous faculty strikes as they demanded months worth of missing pay from the institution. Gideon and his classmates often found their classes canceled as the government failed to pay their professors. Between the inconsistency at university and the shut down period from the pandemic, Gideon decided to learn as an apprentice at an electrical shop. He is now constantly busy making money wiring people's homes and installing CCTV cameras. A2S is now planning to hire Gideon to install the CCTV system at our new Youth Center this coming April.

Through our A2S Scholars program, we not only help young adults pursue university education, but we also do everything we can to prepare them for the

real world. What we've discovered over the years is that even the top graduating students from universities struggle to find jobs after finishing their degrees. As a part of our curriculum, we teach our scholars to look for additional opportunities to learn skills. This helps kids like Gideon fill a need in the community beyond their degree to make sure they can make ends meet.

### **Outreach Program**

#### **IDP Camp**

Once a month, our team works hard to deliver a week's worth of food for the 3,500 women and children within a local Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) Camp in Benin City. Those in this camp fled their homes due to terrorist attacks in northern Nigeria and may never return. These people are the most in need in our community as food and necessities are not always attainable. For this reason, we feed them every mouth for a week and once a year provide shoes and other supplies.
