An appeal from our Founder...

When we founded A2S, we wanted to fill a need for many who could not afford the basics in everyday life. We started by providing shoes for kids and the chance to play basketball to forget about life's hardships for a couple of days out of the year.

As my story has evolved, I realize the gifts I have been given throughout my journey have been that of love and consistency. Since the beginning, I have pursued a promise I made to God that I would not give our children less than I was given. A2S is designed to be dynamic on purpose. We listen and take the feedback of our community. We consult with experts and reference data to inform our decisions. This has brought us from shoes, to education, to this next phase of our growth.

Poverty robs the materially poor of one of God's greatest gifts - choice. For the first 10 years of A2S, we built community and focused on providing basic needs like food, clothing, and education for our kids. While this is great to fulfill these rights of personhood, our work should not stop there. Ensuring each child finds a dignified path to success takes more. It takes building agency, restoring choice, and allowing our kids to write their own stories.

As I look at my journey, my community in England helped me discover my potential and embraced my dreams. When I set out to get an education at Davidson, I got more than I bargained for. My time at Davidson College brought me more than a degree. I came away with a God story. I later realized it was a place like Davidson that encourages innovation, higher level thinking, and community that gave me the agency to choose my path forward.

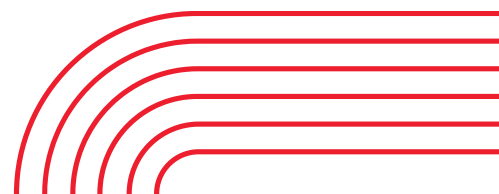
When Molly and I take Osas, my eldest son, to visit colleges in a few years, we will not be thinking about what he will eat, wear, or about whether he will have a roof over his head. Instead, our focus will be on the opportunities available to engage in a Christian community, participate in recreational programs, gain valuable experience through work study, and other resources that will propel his path forward in a way that he can discover his purpose.

The OWA (Opportunity, Wellness, and Advancement) Center will provide these opportunities for our kids in Nigeria. "Owa" means "home" in my native Bini language. So many in our community already call A2S "home" and our staff was passionate about ensuring we name this center to reflect that feeling. At OWA, our kids will have a consistent place to play throughout the year. OWA will be home to programs designed to encourage innovation and provide applied learning experiences that lend themselves to the ever-changing labor landscape in Nigeria. Right now, 70% of Nigerians are under the age of 30. As the population continues to grow, there will be more pressure on our youth in the coming years to be employable not just for the jobs available now, but to create the jobs of the future.

With your help, we can create a path forward for every child to discover God's purpose for their lives. I invite you to go beyond basic needs with us and take this bold step to restore God's design and desire for mankind together by building agency, giving the gift of choice, and empowering those who have so much purpose and potential to be Godly stewards. Thank you for considering making a gift that will last for generations through this Opportunity, Wellness, and Advancement Center in my home of Benin City, Nigeria.

OUR STATEMENT OF MINISTRY

At A2S, our motivation stems from Jeremiah 29:11 that says “For I know the plans I have for you, ‘declares the Lord’, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.”

Access to Success (A2S) is an interdenominational, Christian Mission organization. A2S is dedicated to playing its part to eliminate poverty and provide hope through education and opportunity. Our ministry was founded on the premise that every child and youth should have an opportunity to dream, irrespective of location or circumstances. We are attempting to break the cycle of poverty and provide a dignified path.

Our ministry and approach hinge on a few major theological concepts.

- We are inspired by examples set by our Lord Jesus Christ, who blessed many by loving them unconditionally.
- The A2S ministry follows the teachings of Jesus who instructed us to be not only “hearers but doers.” We profess our faith openly, but we also have a deeply rooted conviction that our actions should align with our proclaimed beliefs.
- As Ephesians 4:11 says, Jesus “grants us all different gifts to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ” and Proverbs 11:14 requests “an abundance of counselors.” On these two tenets, A2S works to empower leaders in all different parts of God’s community through encouraging each individual to embrace their diverse gifts and connect with mentors.
- As Jesus embodied as our greatest Teacher, we believe that access to education and opportunity should be basic rights for all. And following in the steps of Christ, A2S welcomes all. Regardless of background or religious preference, everyone who is touched by what we do and wants to be a part of this work is welcome. Children in need are of diverse backgrounds and religions; our policy supports providing hope and promoting change irrespective of race or religion. We embrace supporters and volunteers from all backgrounds.
- Whether a donor or a beneficiary, we hope to empower more Godly Stewards. We hope to help everyone to be responsible managers of individuals’ diverse and unique gifts of time, talent, and treasure, to help build a more holistic community.

To this effect, we operate a hands-on approach of expressing love through action. A2S ministry acts by providing year-round educational and entrepreneurial opportunities, feeding programs, and other community-based initiatives to help provide hope and a future to those who are not as fortunate as we are.

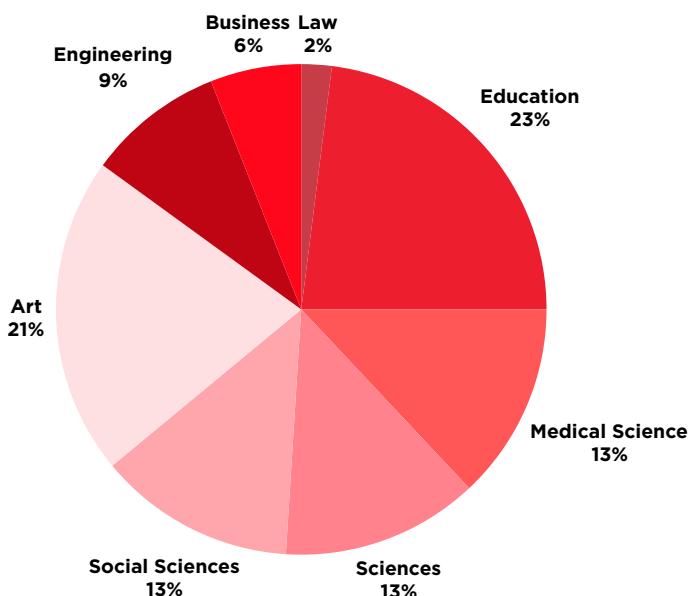

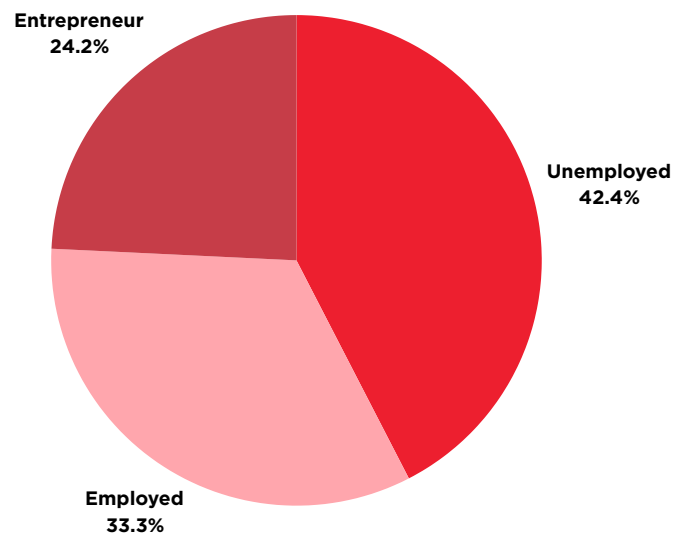

Addressing the need for education.



In 2022, we opened a 20,000 square foot Youth Center in Benin City, our first permanent location in our history. This building currently serves as our education hub where we take a student-centered approach to learning.

Our Education Hub

Spaces include: classrooms, a library, an art studio, a computer lab, a cafeteria, staff offices, and a nursery for children of A2S staff.

What Changes with OWA?

- OWA will have an events space allowing the current Event Hall to become the Library
- The computer lab can then expand into our current Library space
- The previous Dignified Giving Center space will become the art studio
- The art studio will become an additional classroom

With these changes, our capacity at the Youth Center will expand to accommodate 350 children.

As our kids discover their interests, they'll have the opportunity to explore career tracks that interest them.

Engage.

As our kids approach the end of their secondary education and/or enter their University program, they'll choose a career path and have opportunities to apply their learning at the OWA Center.

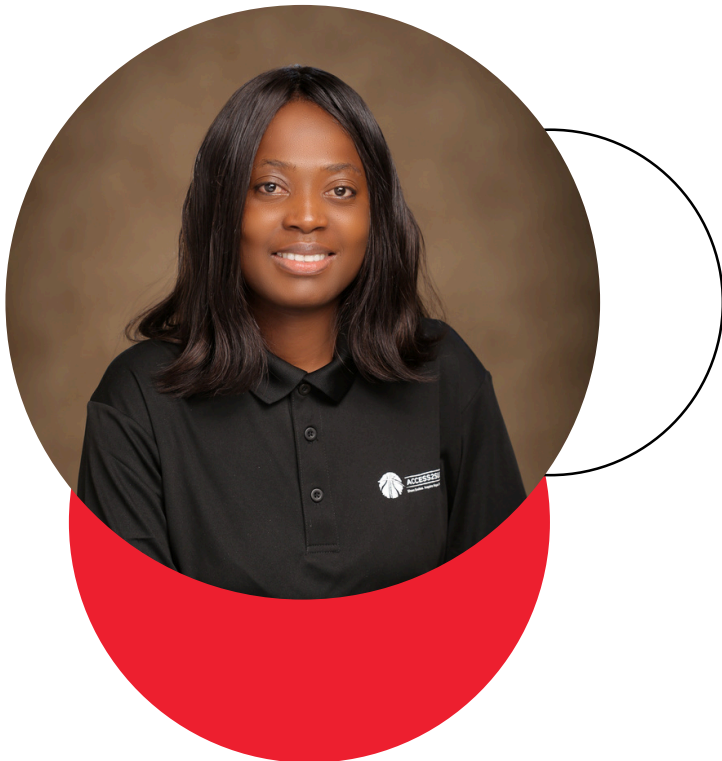
The Case for OWA



THE CASE FOR OWA

As we look towards a brighter for the children and youth we serve, a few key points are clear:

- Children from this background need applied work experience and access to professionals in their desired fields in order to get a job
- Late High School students and University scholars need avenues to earn income to avoid dropping out of school
- Businesses need access to stable electricity, internet, and mentorship resources in order to survive a struggling economy
- A2S is outgrowing the Youth Center space and needs additional storage, staff offices, and program spaces to adequately address the complex problems our children and youth face

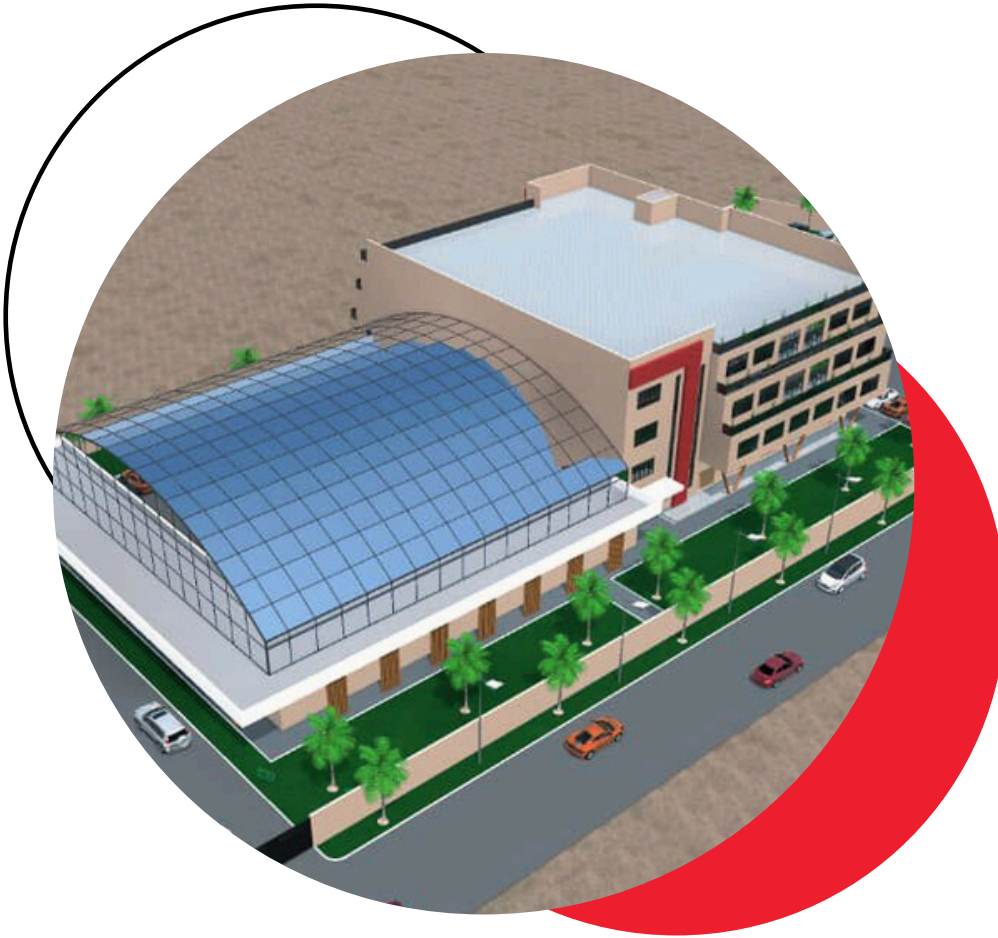

OPPORTUNITY.

Material poverty robs people of the gift of choice - choice means opportunity. In Nigeria, 40% of the population lives on less than \$1/day. Meanwhile the World Bank defines extreme poverty as living on less than \$2.15/day globally. Our youth need access to working opportunities that translate to career readiness.

At the A2S After School Academy 78% of our kids' parents are petty traders. Children from this background struggle to get connected to the job market. Networking and applied learning experiences are essential for a child to understand what is possible and for young adults to know how to step into their field with confidence.



At the OWA Center, youth will have the opportunity for work experience. Participants can:



Build skills and work short term contracts with local and global partners at our **SMART Hub** (see pg 18)



Develop healthy working habits through **Work Study** (see pg 19)



Bring innovative ideas to life at our **Entrepreneur Empowerment Hub** (see pg 20)

Revenue Generation



In 2022, we opened a 20,000 square foot Youth Center in Benin City, our first permanent location in our history. This building enables us to serve 300 youth at our After School Academy as well as advance our entrepreneur, workforce development, and community outreach programs. The Youth Center houses a Dignified Giving Center, a large event space for internal and external use, and a crèche for our mothers on staff. We also purchased an additional plot of land for future development during Phase I.

In 2024, we are kicking off a capital campaign for the A2S Opportunity, Wellness, and Advancement Center — the OWA Center. Owa means home in the Edo language, the local dialect in Benin City. This center will serve as a hub for our career development and athletic programs. A key feature of the building will be three basketball courts where our Basketball + Empowerment Camps will take place. There will be a SMART Hub and an entrepreneur co-working space inside the OWA Center.

Our first two phases allow us to generate outside revenue from space rentals; this final phase is about creating jobs that meet needs in the community. We are currently exploring vocational training opportunities to pilot in the coming years. Our goal is to provide skills training that can immediately put community members to work in for-profit businesses that help fund our A2S programs. This training can also be coupled with our entrepreneurial training to spark new local businesses.



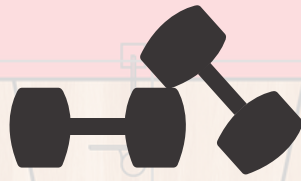

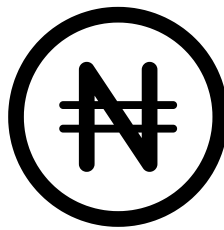
WORK STUDY PROGRAM

Overview

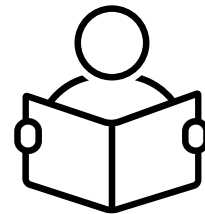

Work study is a common opportunity at universities across the United States that is not available at similar institutions in Nigeria. As our kids get older, they are under more pressure from their parents to help support the family. This program will provide relief to students and their families as the student has the opportunity to continue to pursue higher education.

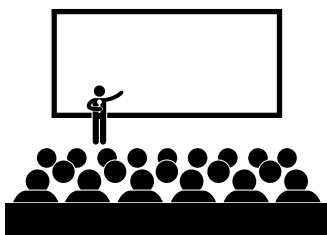

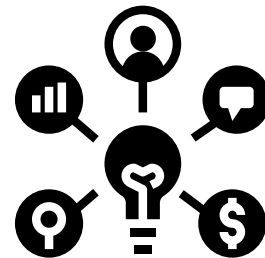

REVENUE GENERATION AT A2S

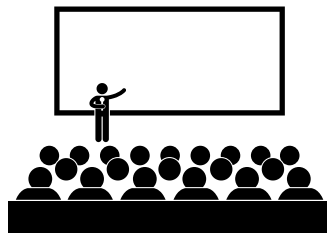
Overview

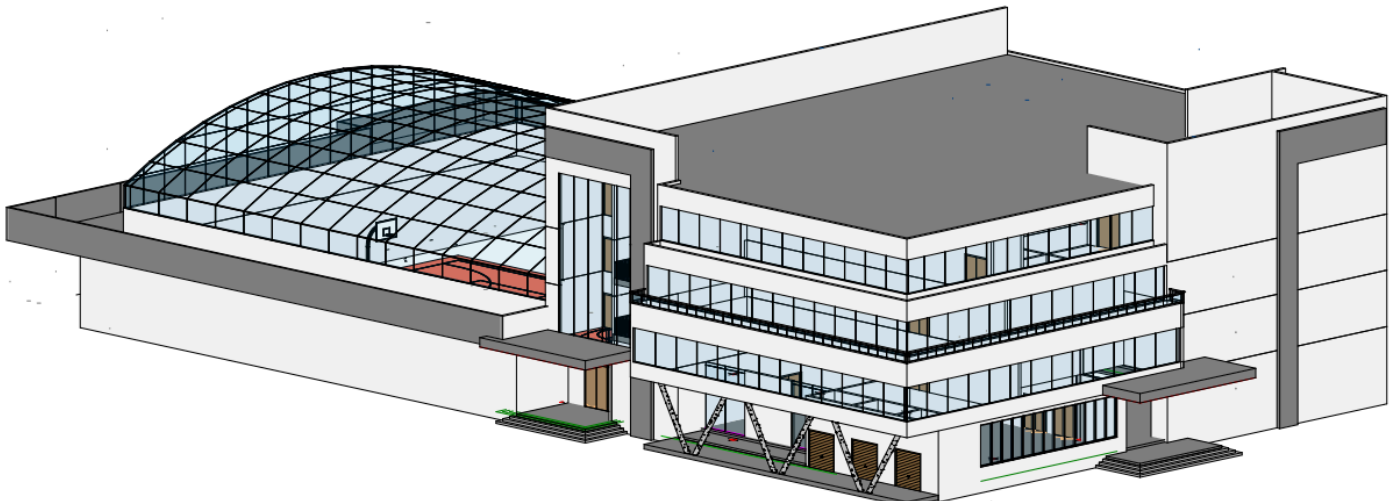

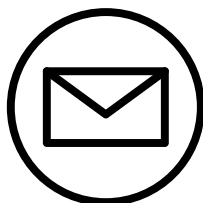
